

BRADFIELD

Zachariah Bradfield, b. Loudon co. Va. 1777: d. June 28, 1846, son of Jonathan and Elizabeth (Stone) Bradfield. Elizabeth Stone was the dau. of Thomas who died in Prince William co. Va. 1791. Zachariah m. ab. 1800. Mary Wells b. Oct. 9, 1783, in Prince William co. Va. She died Nov. 20, 1877. Both are buried in Harrisonville Cemetery. They settled in Scipio tp. in 1819, coming from Wood co. W. Va. near Parkersbury where they settled after 1811 having lived at that date in Hardy c. Va. now W. Va. He is listed as having voted in the first election in Scipio tp.

During the Civil War Mr. Combs made many trips on foot into
army camps, carrying large packages of letters and gifts to the
soldiers from their home folks. He would remain several days,
collecting letters from among the soldiers and delivered them
to the families at home. On these journeys Mr. Combs went
unarmed except for a cane with which he walked. This cane
was of a secret make, having a removable handle to which a
sharp dagger was attached. So far as known he never had
occasion to use this weapon for his own protection.

Robt. Combs lived during the war, near Harrisonville, Ohio, where he was a respected, industrious farmer. He was about fifty years of age, weighed near one hundred and fifty-five, and stood five feet ten inches in his boots. He was possessed of iron will and physique, and alike patriotic and fearless.

He had two sons in Co. H. 36th Ohio Inf. and visited the company frequently during the three years beginning Aug. 12th 1861. On these visits he sometimes tramped thirty to thirty five miles, nearly or quite alone, through the enemies country.

He carried no weapons except a cane, whose handle was readily detached, and became the handle of a dagger-like blade six or seven inches long, a dangerous weapon in the hands of such a man.

He always made known his intended visits in advance and therefore brought, not only a jovial disposition, but letters, socks, mittens and other little comforts too tedious to mention. When his visit ended, he would again load with letters, trophies, money and indeed any thing we had to send home, all of which was faithfully delivered. On one visit he carried a package of seventy pounds weight, from Somerville, W. Va., (then Va.) to camp Piatt on the Kanawha River, a distance of more than forty miles-two or three accompanied him on this trip, some of whom tried to induce him to throw away a fine side saddle in his package. He replied, "No, if Bob Combs ever reaches his destination, this saddle will."

The following lines are to his memory, by one he served.

Our Old-time Friend (Robt. Combs)

Twas in those days, And long since spent,
When strong men's hearts by fear were rent,
Twas when the North with sword in hand,
Went forth to save Columbia's land.

A braver man, a heart more true,
Ne'er tried to serve the boys in blue,
Thou hadst the courage well we knew,
To be the same, the war all through.

You brought our mail, you found our camp,
Though long and weary was the tramp,
You cheered the hearts in our brave band,
While we sojourned in Dixie's land.

You took our letters, trinkets rare,
We knew them safe within your care,
You pressed our hand, you bade adieu,
And cheered us on to victories new.

With hearts still loyal to our friend,
These lines a tribute we would send,
If here no more, we clasp thy hand,
We hope to meet in that blest land.

Adieu, adieu, our old-time friend,
Thou didst prove faithful to the end;
Thou didst not seek for fames renown;
Lay down the cross and take the crown.

Greely, Colorado. January 11, 1896

The above was found among papers of Julia and Wilson G. Giles, former Rutland township residents now deceased who moved to Colorado, and at this date were living in Greely. Mr. Giles served in the Regt. mentioned and is no doubt the author of this tribute to Mr. Combs, dated the day previous to Mr. Combs' 84th Birthday.

Mr. Combs died about a year and half later. This poem was doubtless intended for publication at that time.

John Douglas m. *** French.

Samuel Downing purchased land in Scipio tp. in 1818. He came from Waterville, Maine in 1815. From Pittsburg he floated down the Ohio river on a raft to Gallipolis, Ohio, from where he removed to Scipio. He was elected one of the first three commissioners of Meigs co. in April 1819, for a term of 3 years. He was a surveyor and a justice of the peace for many years.

He was married to Hannah Harding, and they had six sons and one daughter as follows.

I. Samuel, Jr. died when quite a young man.

II. George was born in Waterville, Maine April 25, 1801, d. 1878 m. 1822 Harriet Chase b. Dec. 20, 1803; d. 1878. She was dau. of Abel and Abigail (Nelson) Chase.

He was a blacksmith by trade, also a surveyor and was for many years a justice of the peace. In 1826 a company of militia was organized and for seven years he held a commission as its lieutenant, when the company disbanded. **Noted** for his great strength, he was said to be the strongest man in southern Ohio. Many stories were told of his remarkable feats in lifting great weights. Ch. 1. Cordilla d. young, 2. Maria Louise b. 1831, m. Alvin Riggs, 3. Hebe J. b. 1839, m. 1855, John W. Decarp

III. Rodney, b. 1802 in Waterville, Maine, d. 1886 in Middleport, Ohio: m. 1825, Maria Black. She d. 1870, he m. 2nd Lorinda Downing of Hardin, Ohio. He built flatboats, which he used in trade on the Mississippi. He kept a country store in or near Rutland, Ohio. In 1835 he built a steamboat, the Gen. Harrison, at the Steedman farm on Leading Creek, to be used for Cincinnati and New Orleans trade. He was Clerk of Common Pleas Court of Meigs co. for three terms. He moved to Middleport in 1847.

known as "Major" Downing.
